



## Eagle Point High School ~ School-Based Health Center (SBHC)

### Parent Options Letter

Eagle Point High School SBHC is operated by the Rogue Community Health (RCH) in collaboration with the Jackson County School District 9

Dear Parent,

The Eagle Point High School Based Health Center (SBHC) gives parents and guardians of students to make certain decisions about whether or not the SBHC can treat your student, and to what degree.

### **There are three options for parents and guardians to choose from:**

#### **Option #1**

Students who are over the age of 15 can consent for their own care based on Oregon law and the student's income will be considered as the basis of charges for services. For most students this means that the sliding-fee scale would be zero for income, which means little or no co-pay or out of pocket expense. **If you choose this option, you do not need to complete any forms.**

#### **Option #2**

Parents/guardians can consent for student to receive care at the SBHC. With this consent, the household annual income and number of people in the household will be the basis of sliding-fee scale charges for services and supplies provided. A visit summary will be sent home with your student anytime your student is seen at the SBHC. **If you choose this option, please complete the attached *Consent for Health Care Services*.**

#### **Option #3**

Parents/guardians who do not wish for their student to be treated or receive ANY services at the SBHC can opt-out. **If you choose this option, please complete the *Opt-Out Form*.**

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact the SBHC at (541) 830-6617. Thank you for considering the EPHS SBHC as a way to provide your student with primary and preventative health care.

In order to provide your student with the best care we can, your student may be asked to fill out a "satisfactory survey" for us. This is completely anonymous and voluntary. A student can refuse to take the survey and this will not affect their ability to get health care at the SBHC. The questions on the survey are about their experience at the SBHC as well as a few general questions about their health.
