GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Assess, deliver and monitor daily student health care, including medication and treatment administration, with registered nurse supervision and consultation
- Comply with all applicable school district policy and procedure, health services practices, and scope of practice for LPN licensure
- Communicate with and assist the classroom teacher in identifying health related concerns impacting delivery of the instructional program
- Provide direct health care to medically fragile or nursing dependent students.
- Provide supplementary instructional support to medically fragile or nursing dependent students under the direction of the classroom teacher.
- Communicate with and assist instructional staff in the delivery of the instructional program
- Monitor students in a variety of settings (e.g., classroom, transportation, field trips) for the purpose of providing care as defined by student health plans and assessment of student needs.
- Implement student health care plans and emergency care plans as directed by the registered nurse
- Participate in ongoing communication with the registered nurse regarding student health issues
- Assist in the monitoring and attainment of individual student health goals
- Teach self care skills to students and assist in modifying the environment to promote self care
- Assist with maintaining program continuity in daily student routines of learning, eating, grooming and toileting
- Provide leadership in reviewing emergency procedures and monitoring communicable disease concerns
- Report outcomes of nursing care, including delegated tasks, to the supervising registered nurse and other designated personnel.
- Conduct vision and hearing screenings and ensure immunization compliance
- Provide support in identifying and reporting suspected cases of abuse/neglect
- Participate in health-promoting prevention/intervention efforts
- Maintain accurate and current records pertaining to student health room visits, medication and treatment administration, immunizations, screening results, and injury reports
- Support Behavior Intervention Plans for students as indicated in IEP's
- Inventory and maintain adequate health room supplies
- Other duties as assigned
